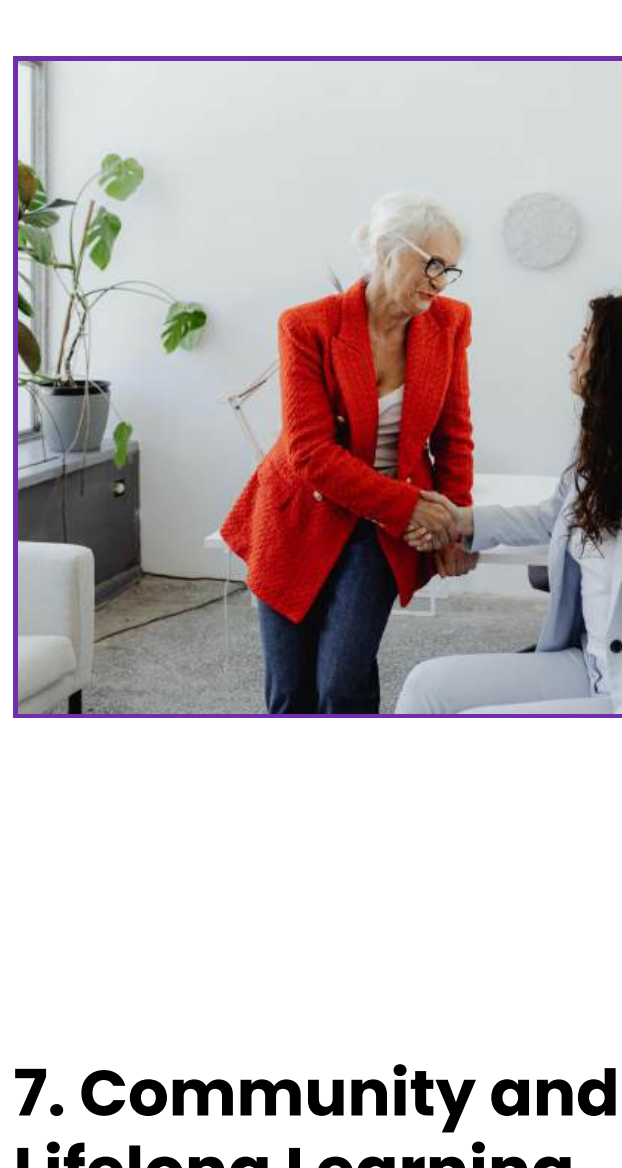


4. Isolation and Burnout Avoidance

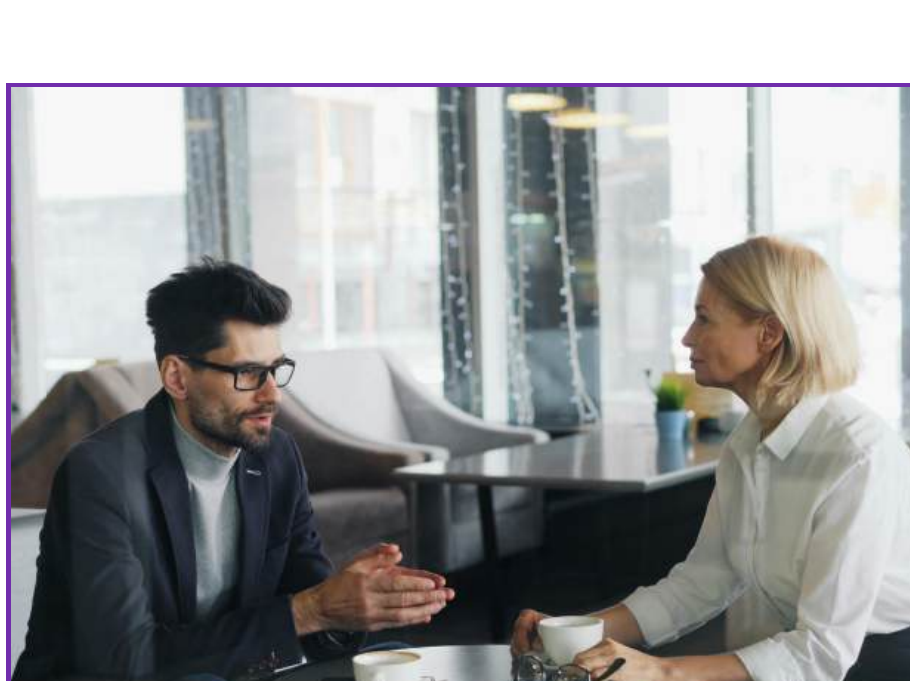


6. Increased Ethical Awareness
